ORDINANCE NO. 13

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING SOLICITATION IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA:

SECTION 1 SOLICITING IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS.

- (a) No solicitor, peddler, hawker, itinerant merchant, transient vendor of merchandise, or other person shall go in and upon private residences in the City for the purpose of soliciting orders for the sale of services, goods, wares and merchandise, and/or for the purpose of disposing of and/or peddling or hawking the same not having been requested or invited so to do by the owner or owners, occupant or occupants of said private residences.
- (b) Nothing herein contained shall be construed as permitting a transient trader to operate without the license required by Article 1, 2 and 3 of Ordinance No. 14.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the 19th day of September, 1951.
