Ordinance No. 14-021

An Ordinance of the Palmer City Council Amending Palmer Municipal Code Section 2.05.050 Mayor Compensation to Provide for a Mechanism to Decline Compensation

THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA ORDAINS:

Section 1. Classification. This ordinance shall be permanent in nature and shall be incorporated into the Palmer Municipal Code.

Section 2. Severability. If any provisions of this ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstances are held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and the application to the other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.


Section 3. Palmer Municipal Code section 2.05.050 is hereby amended to read as follows (new language is underlined and deleted language is stricken):


2.05.050 Compensation.

- A. The mayor’s salary shall be fixed by code provision and may be changed by ordinance amendment at any time except during the 60-day period immediately preceding a general municipal election.
- B. Salary changes become effective the first Monday immediately following the next general city election subsequent to the adoption of the salary change.
- ~~C. B.~~ Compensation shall be \$24,000 per year.
- ~~D. C.~~ The mayor shall not be entitled to receive any other or additional compensation from the city for any service to the city except as provided by this code.
 - 1. Remunerations from federal, state or local government authorities for positions to which the mayor is appointed shall not be construed as compensation from the city for the purposes of this section.
- E. The mayor may decline compensation by completing the form required to decline compensation.

Section 4. Effective Date. Ordinance No. 14-021 shall take effect upon adoption by the City of Palmer City Council.
