ORDINANCE NO. 215

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 8(a) AND SECTION 9(a) OF ORDINANCE NO. 145 RELATING TO PERMITS TO USE CITY PARKS AND PARKWAYS.

THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA ORDAINS:

Section 1. Classification. This ordinance shall be of a permanent nature and shall become a part of the City of Palmer Code of Ordinances.

Section 2. Severability. If any provisions of this ordinance, or any application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and the application to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

Section 3. Amendment of Section 8(a) of Ordinance No. 145. Section 8(a) of Ordinance No. 145 is hereby amended by adding the following thereto:

Park rules and regulations, including standards for the issuance of permits hereunder, and all supplementary rules and regulations, shall be promulgated by the City Manager, subject to the approval of the City Council.

Section 4. Amendment of Section 9(a) of Ordinance No. 145. Section 9(a) of Ordinance No. 145 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 9. Enforcement and Penalties. (a) Any peace officer or City of Palmer policeman or any City of Palmer employee may enforce the provisions of this ordinance. Violations of this ordinance, or any rules or regulations or permits promulgated or issued hereunder, shall subject the violator to the penalties established for an ordinance violator.

Section 5. Publication and Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective ten days after its adoption and publication shall be by posting a copy hereof on the City Hall bulletin board for a period of ten days following its adoption, and notice of public hearing shall be given by such posting at least five days before final passage.
