Summary Statement/Background:

Alaska community leaders including those in the City of Palmer have traditionally sought ways to encourage senior citizens to remain in the state when they retire rather than moving to the Lower 48 states. Currently the State of Alaska demands a \$150,000 exemption to Residential Real Property to benefits senior citizen and disabled veteran homeowners. This action assists both groups with the financial ability to stay in their homes longer.

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough enacted a change to increase the exemption limit after a citizen vote. The Matanuska Susitna Borough currently adds an additional \$114,000 exemption, for a total of \$264,000. The City of Palmer needs to also consider an increase to the exemption limit. Past reasons for the exemption revolve around cost mitigation including Alaska's high heating costs in the winter and transportation costs.

The Home Rule government system by which the City of Palmer operates permits these changes to occur through the authority of the City Council.

Ordinance No. 22-007

An Ordinance of the Palmer City Council Amending City of Palmer Municipal Code 3.12.032, Residential Real Property Exemption, To Increase the Assessed Value of a Single Parcel of Residential Real Property Owned and Occupied by the Owner of Record as the Owner's Permanent Place of Residence in the City from Sixty-Eight Thousand Dollars to One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars

WHEREAS, Alaska community leaders including those in the City of Palmer have traditionally sought ways to encourage senior citizens to remain in the state when they retire rather than moving to the Lower 48 states; and

WHEREAS, Currently the State of Alaska demands a \$150,000 exemption to Residential Real Property for senior citizen and disabled veteran homeowners; and

WHEREAS, This action assists both groups with the financial ability to stay in their homes longer; and

WHEREAS, The Matanuska Susitna Borough recently added, via a vote of its' citizens, an additional \$114,000 exemption, for a total of \$264,000; and

WHEREAS, Past reasons for the exemption revolve around cost mitigation including Alaska's high heating costs in the winter and transportation costs; and

WHEREAS, The Home Rule government system by which the City of Palmer operates permits these changes to occur through the authority of the City Council.

THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA, ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Classification. This ordinance shall be permanent in nature and shall be incorporated into the Palmer Municipal Code.

<u>Section 2.</u> Severability. If any provisions of this ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstances are held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and the application to the other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

<u>Section 3.</u> Palmer Municipal Code Section 3.12.032 is hereby amended to read as follows (new language is underlined and deleted language is stricken):

Sixty eight One Hundred Twenty Five One Hundred Fifty thousand dollars of assessed value of a single parcel of residential real property owned and occupied by the owner of record as the owner's permanent place of residence in the city shall be exempt from the city tax levy on real property within the city.

<u>Section 4.</u> Effective Date. Ordinance No. 22-007 shall take effect upon adoption by the city of Palmer City Council.
