NOTICE OF ELECTION


NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, in accordance with the Act of Congress of May 28, 1936 (49 Stat. 1388), and an Act of Congress of August 24, 1949 (63 Stat. 627) authorizing the City of Palmer, Alaska, to enter into an agreement to purchase from the United States a sewerage system provided pursuant to said Act of Congress of August 24, 1949, to pay therefor a purchase price of \$250,000.00, incur indebtedness, issue general obligation bonds, and in accordance with Ordinance No. 24 of said City of Palmer, passed and approved the 10th day of September, 1952, for the submission of the hereinafter stated proposition to the qualified electors of said City of Palmer whose names appear on the last tax assessment roll of said municipality for municipal tax purposes that being the roll prepared for the calendar year 1952. A special election will be held in the City of Palmer, Alaska on Tuesday, the 18th day of November, 1952, between the hours of 8 o'clock A.M. on said day, the polling place for which shall be at the Co-op Recreation Hall.

At said election will be submitted to the qualified electors of said municipality, whose names appear on the last tax assessment roll for said municipality for the calendar year 1952, the following proposition:

Shall the City of Palmer, Alaska, incur indebtedness in the sum of \$250,000.00, for the purpose of acquiring the following work of a permanent nature: Extension to the sewerage collection system; to be constructed by the United States of America and sold to the City of Palmer at a price not in excess of \$250,000.00, said indebtedness to bear interest at 2% per annum, to be evidenced by a Project Construction and Sales Agreement between the City of Palmer and the United States and by general obligation bonds to mature in not to exceed twenty years, secured by a pledge of the full faith and credit of the City of Palmer, Alaska, and to levy a tax or taxes sufficient to pay the interest and principal of said bonds when due, all as provided by Ordinance No. 24 of the City of Palmer, passed and approved the 10th day of September, 1952, and assume the obligation to operate and maintain said public work in perpetuity.

The polls will be open during the hours above stated and the following persons, to-wit: All persons whose names appear on the tax assessment roll for the City of Palmer, for municipal taxation for the year 1952, who are otherwise qualified electors of said City of Palmer, shall be entitled to vote at said election.
