

CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA

ORDINANCE NO. 32

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE MOTOR VEHICLE CODE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA, WHEREVER APPLICABLE, AS THE MOTOR VEHICLE CODE OF THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA, THAT:

Section 1. The laws of the Territory of Alaska dealing with the operation of motor vehicles, wherever they are applicable to operation of motor vehicles in organized municipalities, shall be the motor vehicle code of the City of Palmer.

Section 2. The bound booklet entitled ALASKA TRAFFIC LAWS, REVISED REGULATIONS THEREUNDER, ACLA 1949, Section 124, as amended by Session Laws of Alaska, 1951 shall constitute, insofar as said laws are applicable, the laws of the City of Palmer, Alaska, relating to traffic regulation.

Section 3. The booklet and the laws referred to in Section 2 of this Ordinance are hereby incorporated in this Ordinance as if set forth therein, and made a part hereof as if set forth in full.

Section 4. A copy of the bound booklet entitled Alaska TRAFFIC LAWS, REVISED REGULATIONS THEREUNDER, is on file with the City Clerk of the City of Palmer.

Section 5. Every act prohibited by this Ordinance is hereby declared unlawful; unless another penalty is expressly provided by this Ordinance for any particular provision or section, every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this Ordinance, or any rule or regulation adopted or issued in pursuance thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each act of violation and every day upon which any such violation shall occur shall constitute a separate offense. In addition to the foregoing fine and/or imprisonment, the driver's license of the violator shall be suspended in every instance where said traffic code of the Territory of Alaska provides for suspension, and for the period of suspension provided in said code.

Section 6. An emergency is hereby declared to exist; that the usual rules of procedure be suspended and that this Ordinance shall be read in full and again by its title and placed upon its final passage by the Council and approved by the Mayor and City Clerk.
