

CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA

ORDINANCE NO. 436

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 9.22.010 (GAMBLING) OF THE PALMER MUNICIPAL CODE.

THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA, ORDAINS:

Section 1. Classification. This ordinance shall be of a permanent nature and shall become a part of the City of Palmer Code of Ordinances.

Section 2. Severability. If any provisions of this ordinance, or any application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and the application to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

Section 3. Section 9.22.010 is amended to read as follows:

9.22.010 Prohibited when. A. Each and every person who deals, plays or carries on, opens or causes to be opened, or who conducts, either as owner, proprietor or employee, whether for hire or not, any game of chance with cards, such as faro, monte, roulette, rouge et noir, lansquenet, rondo, vigt-et-un, blackjack (twenty-one), poker, draw poker, stud poker, brag, bluff or thaw, or any person or persons who play with cards, dice or any device, for any valuable thing, whether the same are for money, checks, credit, or anything representative of value, within the city, shall be deemed an ordinance violator.


B. This provision does not prohibit activities duly authorized under AS 05.15, by a qualified organization, a municipality or an operator.

Section 4. Publication and Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption. Publication shall be by posting a copy hereof on the City Hall bulletin board for a period of ten (10) days following its adoption, and further it shall be published by being printed and included in the Palmer Municipal Code at its next regular supplementation and printing. A notice of public hearing shall be given by such posting at least five (5) days before final passage.
