## RESOLUTION NO. 12

## SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION - July 10, 1951

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF PALMER:

That the following notice of special municipal election be published in a newspaper of general circulation for four (4) consecutive weeks preceding the special municipal election of July 10, 1951; that publication be made on the following dates: June 8, 15, 22, 29, 1951, in the Valley Frontiersman, published at Palmer, Alaska:

## NOTICE OF SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION

- 1. <u>Time of Election</u>. Notice is hereby given that on the 10th day of July, 1951, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. at Palmer, Alaska, a special municipal election will be held for the purpose of determining whether the City of Palmer should levy a retail sales and service sales tax.
- 2. Eligibility of Voters. Those eligible to vote in the Special Municipal Election must possess all of the following qualifications.
  - (a) They must be citizens of the United States, twenty-one years of age and over.
  - (b) They must be actual and bonafide residents of Alaska and must have been such residents continuously during the entire year immediately preceding the election and must have been such residents continuously for thirty (30) days next preceding the election in the City of Palmer, Alaska, in the city voting precinct in which they vote.
  - (c) They must be able to read and write the English language as prescribed and provided in Title 38, Chapter 1, Section 2, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1949 and not barred from voting by any other provision of law.
- 3. Proposition to be Voted Upon. The following proposition will be submitted to the electors at the special municipal election in accordance with Territorial Law.

Shall the City of Palmer levy and collect, pursuant to Territorial Law, a consumers sales tax of two percent (2%) of the sales price on all retail sales and services made within the City for the purpose of raising general revenue for the operation of the municipal government.

4. Polling Place. Polling place within the corporate limits for the special municipal election will be as follows:
