

RESOLUTION NO. 19

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA

It was moved by Mr. Hagen and seconded by Mr. Sandvik that be it hereby resolved that an emergency exists due to the coming of winter and the procedure for calling for bids be waived in the purchase of a caterpillar grader and that the Mayor be authorized to accept the offer of the Northern Commercial Company for a caterpillar diesel No. 112 Motor Grader at the price of \$14,111.94 and that he will make further arrangements in its transportation from Anchorage to Palmer. This was carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 20

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA

It was moved by Mr. Mick and seconded by Mr. Severns that the City Council adopt a resolution establishing a Planning Commission for the City of Palmer to be comprised of seven citizens appointed by the Mayor subject to the approval of the Council in accordance with the Provisions of the Compiled Laws of the Territory of Alaska for 1949. Said Commission to consist of C. C. Bailey, Charles Wilson and Betty Mears for three year appointments, Oliver Onkka, Ed Smith for two year appointments, Richard Demming and Lew Hanks for one year appointments. This was carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 21

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA

It was moved by Mr. Ward and seconded by Mr. Mick that be it hereby resolved that whereas at the regular Council meeting of October 24, 1951 the City Council went on record as approving Caterpillar Diesel Model No. 112 Motor Grader and whereas on the attempt by the Mayor to make this purchase said piece of equipment was found to be unavailable whereupon the Mayor ordered Caterpillar Diesel model No. 12 Motor Grader at a price of \$16,318.45 wherefor the Council goes on record as ratifying the Mayor's action. This was carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. --- 22

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA

The bond ordinance was then presented and read. Upon motion by Severns, seconded by Brown the rules were suspended and a roll call vote was had on the resolution "To adopt Bond Ordinance No. 20 and to call for a special election January 29, 1952 to request the voters to give authorization to incur indebtedness in the amount of \$300,000 for a water works system.
