

RESOLUTION NO. 63.

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA

WHEREAS, the City of Palmer has heretofore received a number of applications from people living outside the corporate limits of said city for water service through the municipal water system, and

WHEREAS, the Common Council has considered and discussed at length the pros and cons of the advisability of selling water to users outside the city, coming to an unanimous conclusion that the difficulties and disadvantages to the city of serving such users are great and many, and

WHEREAS, among the numerous reasons discussed for not serving said users is the major one that the people of the City of Palmer have bonded themselves for the municipal water system, being fully responsible for the payment of the purchase price thereof over a period of 20 years and it appearing inequitable to sell water to people outside the city who bear no responsibility for the payment for said system, at the same rate water is sold to users within the city, and

WHEREAS, it is the judgment of this council that it would be impracticable to supply water to users outside the city charging such outside users a higher rate than is charged users within the city.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Common Council of the City of Palmer: That it shall be and hereby is the policy of the City of Palmer not to sell water to users outside the corporate limits of the city except in special cases upon a showing of good cause and urgency for such service.

That the City of Palmer shall not accept nor consider applications for water service outside the city henceforth unless and until good cause is shown by the applicant for such service as set forth hereinabove.

This resolution adopted by vote of the Common Council this 3rd. day of August, 1954.
