

RESOLUTION NO. 67

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA

WHEREAS certain groups of citizens of the city of Palmer, representing the American Legion Auxiliary, the American Legion, the Kiwanis Club, the Ministerial Association, the Women's Temperance Union, the Woman of the Moose, the Loyal Order of Moose and various other groups have heretofore petitioned the City Council for action to control the sale of certain comic books within the city of Palmer, and

WHEREAS such comic books are identified and described as horror comic books, pocket books and magazines portraying deeds of brutality and violence, sexual indecencies, and being devoted to matter which is gruesome, debasing, ghoulish, weird, horrible, vicious, depraved, inhuman, and otherwise calculated to inspire in readers feelings of terror, fear, revulsion, disgust or morbid curiosity, and

WHEREAS the City Council of Palmer has gone on record as being in sympathy with the purposes on said groups in alleviating the situation by eliminating the distribution of such comic books to children, by sale or otherwise

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the city of Palmer hereby declares itself to be opposed to the sale of such horror comic books, pocket books and magazines to children, and that the said City Council shall cause a study to be made of said situation, to be made for the purpose of considering legislation for the control of the sale of such publication to children.

This Resolution passed, approved and adopted by the City Council for the City of Palmer this 8th day of March, 1955.
