RESOLUTION NO. 80

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA

WHEREAS, the City of Palmer is a municipal corporation of the first class, having been organized as such under the laws of the Territory of Alaska in 1951, and

WHEREAS, since the said incorporation the City of Palmer has enjoyed continuous growth and local improvements, including what has been described as the finest municipal water system in the Territory of Alaska, and

WHEREAS, said water system depends upon deep walls for its water supply, the source of which is limited, and

WHEREAS, the City is presently calling for bids for the drilling of another water well for the purpose of providing water to meet the needs of an ever-growing population; there being a doubt, even at the present time that more than one additional well can be drilled without limiting the source of supply by virtue of lowering of the underground water table from heavy pumping, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be expedient, in the interest of good planning for the future of the City that a new and greater source of water supply be obtained for the future use and the future growth of the City and surrounding areas in the Matanuska Valley,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Land Management be requested to withdraw and set aside for the use of the City of Palmer as a source of future water supply, all that area to the north or Palmer known as and embraced within the Moose Creek Watershed,

PASSED AND APPROVED by the Common Council of the City of Palmer, Alaska this 23 day of July, 1957.
