RESOLUTION NO. 160

A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A RESIDENT FIRE RATE SURVEYOR IN ALASKA.

WHEREAS, fire insurance rates are established in Alaska by the Pacific Fire Rating Bureau in San Francisco, and only four (4) trips are made to Alaska between April and October, and

WHEREAS, the purpose of these trips is to inspect newly constructed buildings and to establish fire rates, and

WHEREAS, it is possible that from the date a fire rate is requested by an insurance agent, or building owner, or municipality until the time it becomes available may be a lapse of six to ten months, and,

WHEREAS, the backlog of requests now pending cannot be met by the present visitation program without causing undue delay in their processing, and


WHEREAS, a Resident Fire Surveyor in Alaska can be justified on the basis of population, total insurable values, premiums paid and the rate of new construction, then


NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Palmer resolves:

That the City of Palmer, Alaska, hereby requests the Governing Committee, Pacific Fire Rating Bureau to place a Resident Fire Rate Surveyor in Alaska, preferably in the south-central area of the State.

Publication of this resolution shall be made by posting a copy hereof on the City Hall bulletin board for a period of ten days following its passage and approval.
