A RESOLUTION PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE CITY CHARTER OF THE
CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA.

The City of Palmer, Alaska, resolves:


To commence proceedings by the vote of four or more members of the Council pursuant to Section 14.2 of the City Charter, to amend the Charter in the following listed particulars, and to submit such proposed amendments at the forthcoming general election which is more than sixty days after the adoption of this resolution, and which amendments shall become effective if approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting on each amendment at that time. Each proposed amendment shall be published in The Frontiersman not less than two weeks nor more than four weeks before the election on its ratification. Two copies of each proposed amendment which is ratified by the electors of the City shall be filed with the Secretary of State for Alaska, and in addition one copy shall be filed at the office of the Recorder for the Palmer Recording District, Third District, State of Alaska, as well as copies thereof being preserved in the archives of the City. Each proposed amendment shall become effective upon its ratification.

Proposed Amendment No. 1: yes no

Proposition No. 2: Shall Section 2.2(a) of the Municipal Charter for the City of Palmer be amended so as to reduce the residence requirements of city officers from three years to one year, in the following manner:

Section 2.2(a) "To be eligible to file a nominating petition for election to a city office, a person shall be an elector of the city and shall have been a resident of the city or of territory annexed to the city, or shall have had a combination of residence in the city and in the annexed territory for a period of not less than one year preceding the date of the filing of such petition."

Passed and approved by five members of the City Council of the City of Palmer this 11th day of August, 1970.
