RESOLUTION NO. 214

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO UNDERTAKE PROJECT NO. 07-1-00708, FOR THE EXTENSION OF WATER SERVICE TO THE PALMER INDUSTRIAL PARK, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA, RESOLVES:

That WHEREAS, there is an immediate need to supply water service to the Palmer Industrial Park for fire protection to the City's improvements therein, and to lower the fire insurance rates for such insurance, and to enable the lessee to utilize the improvements, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Council direction the City Manager has heretofore caused Bomhoff & Associates, Engineers, to prepare the necessary plans and specifications for the project, which is now known as Project No. 07-1-00708, and has further purchased the necessary materials therefor, and

WHEREAS, any delay in the commencement of construction on such project greatly increases the danger of ground freezing which would prevent completion of the project this season, which season is already so far advanced that an emergency exists by virtue of the requirements of the pending construction,


NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved:


1. Pursuant to Section 12.2 of the Charter of the City of Palmer, the Council declares an emergency exists, and to preserve and further the public health, safety and welfare, and insure construction being undertaken at the earliest practicable date, the public notice period prescribed by Section 12.3 of the Charter of the City of Palmer for advertisement of a contract for the construction of public improvements is hereby reduced from two weeks to four days.

2. That upon such notice being given, competitive bids should be accepted in accordance with the provisions of Section 12.2 of the Charter of the City of Palmer, for the performance of the necessary work to accomplish Project No. 07-1-00708.

This resolution shall be effective immediately.
