RESOLUTION NO. 221

A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING HOLIDAYS FOR CITY EMPLOYEES

WHEREAS, The City of Palmer has previously designated certain days as holidays by Resolution No. 124 adopted July 23, 1963, and

WHEREAS, the Federal and State Governments have passed legislation recognizing days as holidays in conflict with those previously designated

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:


The following days shall be recognized as holidays with pay for all permanent employees of the City of Palmer:

New Year's Day - January 1
Washington's Birthday - third Monday in February
Memorial Day - last Monday in May
Independence Day - July 4
Labor Day - first Monday in September
Veteran's Day - fourth Monday in October
Thanksgiving Day - fourth Thursday in November
Christmas Day - December 25

When one of these holidays falls on a Saturday or a Sunday, the following Monday shall be recognized in lieu thereof. If the employee's regular work schedule required that he work on one of these holidays, he shall be paid double the usual rate for the day, or if the employee prefers, he may be paid at the regular rate for that day and accumulate an extra day of annual leave, provided he obtain prior approval from the City Manager.

Publication of this resolution shall be by posting a copy of the same on the City Hall bulletin board for a period of ten (10) days.

Passed and approved by the City Council of the City of Palmer, Alaska, this 9th day of February, 1971.
