RESOLUTION NUMBER 231

A RESOLUTION APPOINTING JUDGES AND CLERKS FOR GENERAL ELECTION OF MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH, CITY OF PLAMER, OF OCTOBER 5, 1971, AND RELATED MATTERS:

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA, RESOLVES:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the requirements of law, the following are appointed Judges and Clerks for the General Election of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough and City of Palmer, of October 5, 1971, to serve in the Matanuska-Susitna Borough and City of Palmer voting precinct as herein set forth:

Precinct Number 11, consisting of all of the area within the corporate limits of the City of Palmer, Alaska:

SECTION 2. The judges, three of whom are designated as clerks, shall attend at the voting place at 8:00 A.M. on the 5th day of October, 1971, after taking the oath required by law, and serve there until 8:00 P.M., at which time a Judge will audibly announce the polls closed, after proclaiming thirty (30) minutes advance notice thereof, and thereafter the Judges shall count the check votes cast against the poll list in the manner required by law.

Beginning at 8:00 P.M., or at any time thereafter until their duties have been concluded, the Judges serving at any precinct may excuse from further duties any two Judges, and any two clerks. The count and check of


the votes cast shall be performed by the election officers remaining on duty.

SECTION 3. In the event any of the election officers shall fail to take their office for any reason, the Registrar of the City of Palmer is authorized to appoint other qualified officials to take their place in the manner prescribed by law.

Publication of this Resolution shall be made by posting a copy hereof on the City Hall bulletin board for a period of ten days following its passage and approval.
