WHEREAS, Certain incomplete and misleading information has been reported by the news media concerning the Huskey Manufacturing Company, the Public should be notified as follows:


THE CITY OF PALMER, ALASKA, RESOLVES:

The decrease in trailer sales occassioned largely by the pipeline hold-up and the delay in the Native Land Claims settlement has created a temporary inventory problem with Palmer's Huskey Manufacturing industry. The City is confident this situation will be corrected in the next few months, and will take such steps as appear to be in the public interest to continue this economic base and its apyroll in our area.

The City has undertaken to establish a new growth industry here, and having been briefed by Huskey's management on the long-range plans for the plant, will with the rest of the Community, continue to encourage this permanent employemnt base which provided approximately \$550,000 in payroll last year.


Publication of this Resolution shall be by posting a copy hereof on the City Hall bulletin borad for a period of ten (10) days following its passage and approval.
