## A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING HOLIDAYS FOR CITY EMPLOYEES

WHEREAS, THE CITY OF PALMER, has previously designated certain days as Holidays by Resolution No. 221, adopted February 9, 1971, and

WHEREAS, the City of Palmer, wishes to keep in uniformity with Federal and State Governments on extending Holidays to City employees,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:


The following days shall be recognized as Holidays with pay for all permanent employees of the City of Palmer:

| 1. NEW YEARS DAY         | January 1st                 |
| 2. WASHINGTON'S BIRTHDAY | Third Monday in February    |
| 3. SEWARD'S DAY          | First Monday in March       |
| 4. MEMORIAL DAY          | Last Monday in May          |
| 5. INDEPENDENCE DAY      | July 4th                    |
| 6. LABOR DAY             | First Monday in September   |
| 7. ALASKA DAY            | Third Monday in October     |
| 8. VETERAN'S DAY         | Fourth Monday in October    |
| 9. THANKSGIVING DAY      | Fourth Thursday in November |
| 10. CHRISTMAS DAY        | December 25th               |

When one of these Holidays falls on a Saturday or a Sunday, the following Monday shall be recognized in lieu thereof. If the employees regular work schedule require that he work on one of these Holidays, he shall be paid double the usual rate for the day, or if the employee prefers, he may be paid at the regular rate for that day and accumulate an extra day of annual leave, provided he obtain prior approval from the City Manager.

Publication of this Resolution shall be by posting a copy of the same on the City Hall bulletin board for a period of ten (10) days.
